Feb. 11-This meeting will finalize the plans for the conference. If you are billeting, or helping, PLEASE come!

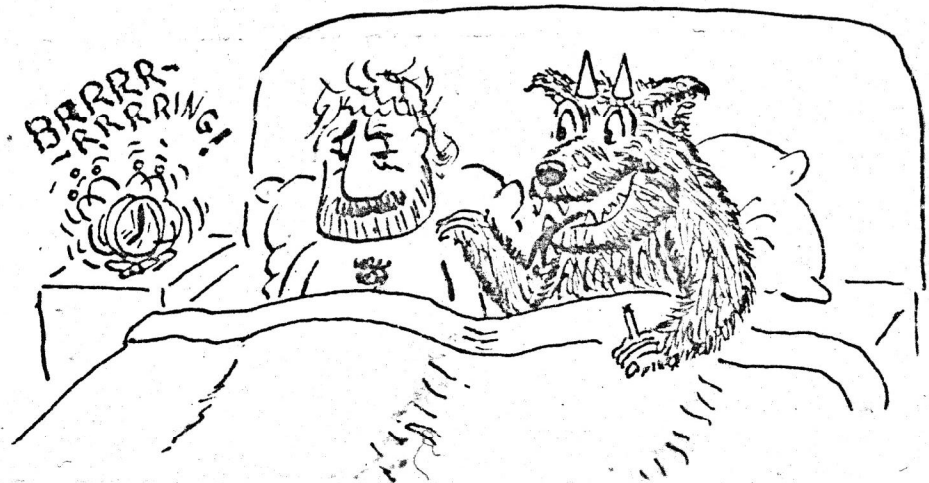
