MAY 6 BACKGAMMON/EUCHRE TOURNAMENT. Preregistration with \$1.00 per person. Prizes awarded.

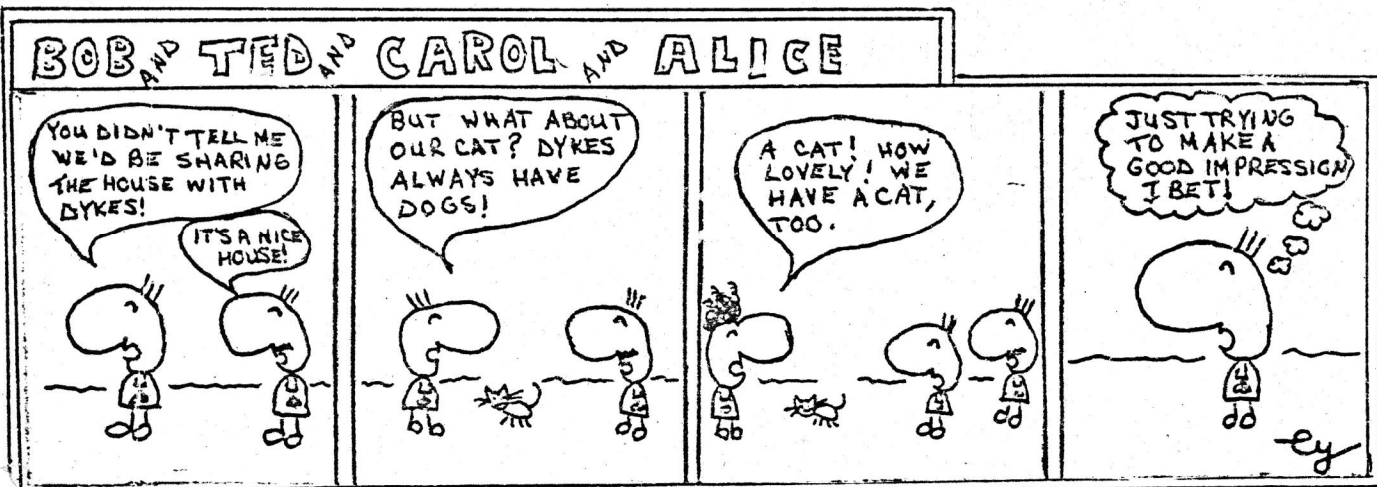
