

LAMBDA

The eleventh lowercase letter of the greek alphabet, lambda, is the forerunner of our letter 'L'. Originally the letter was a picture symbol for the scales often seen being carried by the figure of Justice. With the passage of time, the lambda bore less of a visual resemblance to scales and its meaning became more abstract. It came to represent the concept or qualities of balance.

The Greeks believed balance that was a reconciliation between two opposites and as such was not a stable state one needing continuous adjustment.

Finally, due to the influence of Greek philosophy, the lambda emerged as it in modern-day appears form; the small hook was added to the base of the letter to indicate both that some form of action was necessary to bring about a state of equilibrium and that constant action was necessary to maintain that state once it was achieved.

Owing to the fact that the Romans saw the overall shape of the lambda as suggestive of a flame, it was used as the symbol for lampa - their Latin word for the torch. In our day, scientists seeking a symbol for the wavelength of light drew on the historical past, and the lambda, because of its connection with the torch, was chosen.

In the 1960's, when the quest for Gay Liberation started to emerge as an organized movement the Stonewall. after riots, the lambda was selected as a gay symbol because of its famous historical associations. Previously symbolizing justice, balance, the reconciliation of opposites, unity, the

relationship of human beings to society, freedom, equality, the independance of the individual, and light, the lambda had those qualities which best represented the objective of gay people.

As acceptance of the lamba became more widespread and its popularity grew, use of the symbol spread rapidly across the United States.

lambda's The most recent historical association - with light began to take on an added meaning, one of a social nature. As a symbol for gay people, the lambda has come to represent the "light of knowledge shed into the darkness of ignorance" and promises hope of a new future with dignity for gay men and women everywhere

Today the lambda is recognized as a unique symbol for gay rights, for sexual liberation, for justice and enlightenment, as well as for a needed balance in acceptance of differences by and within all humanity.

ENOUGH IS ENOUGH

As you are no doubt aware, Canada's largest newspaper, Body Gav Politic, faces another appeal on charges arising from a 1977 article about sex between men and boys.

The Ontario Attorney-General's Ministry has served papers on Pink Triangle Press, publishers of Body Politic, appealing last months acquittal and asking the York County Court to substitute a conviction on the charge of mailing indecent, immoral or scurrilous material.

"IT'S THE MOST AP-PEALED SUMMARY CONVICTION CASE IN THE HISTORY OF MANKIND," Body Politic lawyer Clayton Ruby said in an interview. "this is a minor charge. They are not supposed to torture anybody to get a conviction."

Asked whether Body Politic considered the appeal part of a compaign of harassment against the Gay community, Mr. Jackson, president of Pink Triangle Press, said in an interview: "We've wavered about this sometimes, but this seems to make it unmistakeable. There can't be any other conclusion." LET YOUR MP KNOW NOW how you feel about the Ontario system of Justice.
