
## WHAT'S IN A WORD? GAY VERSUS HOMOSEXUAL

It is becoming more widely known that the word 'gay' predates the word 'homosexual' by centuries. The clin-

ical term 'homosexual" compounded of a Greek prefix meaning same and a Latin root meaning of one sex, was invented by German psychologists in the late nineteenth century. In his book, Christianity, Social Tolerance and Homosexuality, historian John Boswell discusses the origins of the word 'gay' to refer to persons erotically attracted to the same sex. Boswell's book won the 1981 American Book Award for History.

In France, the Provencal word 'gai' was used in the thirteenth and fourteenth centuries to designate an openly homosexual person. Elsewhere in France, the word 'gai' as well as the old English 'gay', the Castilian (Spanish) 'gaya' and the German 'gahe' were all used to identify homosexuals among others who were considered sexually loose. In Europe of the Middle Ages, the Christian Church controlled sexuality and its definitions of morality were rigid.

In his book, Boswell speculates that the word 'gay' to refer to homosexuals may have much earlier origins and may have derived from the use of the Greek mythological figure, 'Ganymede'. Ganymede was the beautiful son of the King of Troy who was sexually seduced and then carried off by Zeus to be a cupbearer in heaven. Twelfthcentury European literature abounds with examples of the use of the Ganymede figure and the name was adopted throughout Europe to refer to a gay person. However, in the thirteenth century, the Christian Church, in an attempt to strengthen its control people's lives, began its persecutions of gays, Jews and other non-Christians, Literature either by or about gays, was driven underground, as were gay people themselves.

### HOMOSEXUAL ADOPTS SON IN LANDMARK CASE

Riverside, Calif. (UPI) - A gay man won permanent custody yesterday of his teenage foster son in what his attorney said was the first time a known homosexual had been allowed to adopt a child.

The county agreed to the adoption minutes before a court hearing on a lawsuit filed against it by David Frater, 29. The county, legal protector of the youth, previously denied consent without explanation.

David Frater's attorney, Gloria Allred, who said she believed the adoption to be the first case in the U.S. in which a government agency allowed adoption by a known homosexual, then agreed to drop the lawsuit.

Kevin Dorman Frater, 17, a professed heterosexual, told authorities he lived in 15 foster homes before meeting the elder Frater. Kevin's mother said she was forced to give up custody of her son because of her addiction to heroin and imprisonment on drug charges.
