NO HOMOSEXUALS AS BIG BROTHERS - CANADIANS DECIDE

Truro, N.S/CP - Big Brothers Association of Canada will not follow the action of its U.S. associate and allow homosexuals to become Big Brothers, executive director Frank Fogwell said yesterday.

The 170 Big Brothers agencies across Canada are being notified that the long-standing policy is not

about to change, Fogwell said in a telephone interview from Burlington.

"We are looking for a good influence on our Little Brothers and we do not believe allowing homosexuals to become Big Brothers is the way to achieve it," he said.

He said the Canadian organization is autonomous and does not have to follow the decision in the U.S to allow homosexuals to become Big Brothers with the consent of the mother of the boys.

Two officials of a county branch in Nova Scotia had threatened to resign if the national association changed its policy.

Under the Big Brothers program, boys between the ages of six and sixteen who don't have a father at home are matched with men who can provide companionship on a regular basis. There are also 62 Big Sister agencies in Canada.
