

AND WHAT'S HAPPENING IN TORONTO?

The I.G.A.(International Association of lesbians/gay women and gay men) was founded in 1978. Since then it has been working to link groups from different countries and to collect information on the conditions for gays and lesbians around the world. As well, it has undertaken many actions (in protest against, for examples, police raids and the murder of gays in Mexico, the prison sentence of a gay publisher in Greece, the suspension of a lesbian teacher in Australia, etc.). It has also been lobbying institutions like the United Nations, W.H.O.(World Health Organization), the European Council and the European Parliament to include gay rights among their resolutions.

This year Toronto will be hosting the annual I.G.A. conference as well as a history conference from June 30th to July 7th. A number of us are organizing a dance for March 15th in the Polish Hall in support of the I.G.A. But we need volunteers to help out. 
