

The motion stated: "If any embezelment is discovered of Guelph Gay Equality's money, the police will be notified within 48 hours of discovery of the incident." This will be voted on at the General Meeting on Tues. April 2 1985 (which is also election night!!) Come out and make your vote count. (A vote may be cast by a member in good standing for at least 4 weeks.)

WORLD WISE DANCE

Friday March 15th at the Polish Hall, 5 Empire Storganizing for the seventh annual I.G.A.

(International Gay Association) conference to be held in Toronto on June 30th to July 7th, is getting underway. Along with I.G.A.'s ongoing workshops dealing with long-term lobbying and actions, there will also be discussions concerning youth, health, teachers, media and peace. The more than 200 delegates from 30 different countries who are expected to attend, will give everyone the chance to interact and learn more about the culture and problems of gays and lesbians around the world. In order to assist people from Third World a Travel Assistance Fund is being established.

The history conference with "Sex and the State their Laws our Lives" as its theme will also take place during that week. Lesbians and gay historians will make presentations. Slides and films will be shown during the evenings. As well throughout the week, gay art exhibits, theatre performances, film and video screenings, from many different countries, will be held. The registration fee for I.G.A. delegates is \$40,

for other interested individuals, \$25 and for students, seniors and unemployed, only \$15. Registration forms will be available during G.G.E's weekly meetings.

Here in <u>Guelph</u> we are having a special dance, March 15th to warm up for the July conference. We hope to have an information presentation during the dance about the I.G.A., and conditions for gays and lesbians around the world. There will also be much more info. available about the conference as well as T-shirt buttons and copies of the Pink Book (an I.G.A. project funded by the Dutch government about the international gay situation). The dance will be held in the upstairs room of the Polish Hall starting at 8pm. Tickets are 3.00 at the door.
