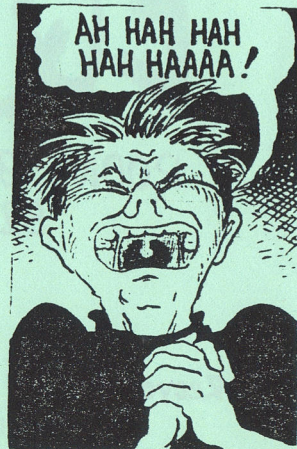
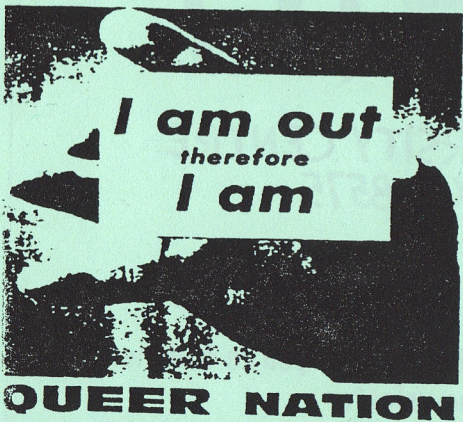
\*Pride Day is July 3rd this year, because of the 25th anniversary of Stonewall being held just after the Gay Games in New York City. This years slogan is:
