# **Activities Coordinator**



There's nothing worse than seeing the look of disappointment and disapproval on the faces of friends or family members after you've come out to them, after you've introduced them to your new lover, or when you speak with them about issues of importance to the gay and lesbian community. Even though they may respond with acceptance, understanding, love and support and treat you as well as they always have, it may be hard for you to escape the sinking feeling that you've let them down.

Feeling as if you've failed in the eyes of those you love is a difficult emotion to work through. You know you could make everything "right" again with them if you told them you weren't gay, if you brought home a lover of the opposite sex, or if you stopped discussing issues that affect your gay community.


