trays the decadent fantastical fantasies of their homosexual dream lives.

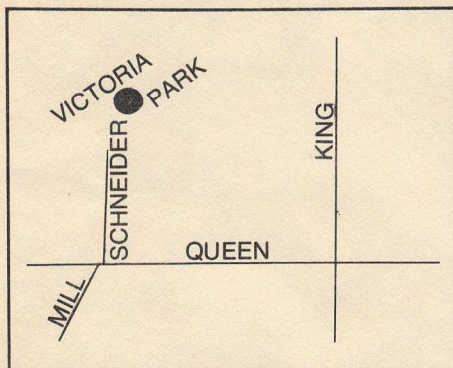
