Digitized Files - JPEG Version: The JPEG version is of **lower quality** than the PDF version, but will generally be **faster to download** than the PDF version. The files are set so that each page image takes up the full height of your viewing window; increasing the height of your viewing window will increase the size of the text. If your Internet download speed is lower, then this is a better option than the PDF version.

Digitized Files - PDF Version: The PDF version is of **higher quality** than the JPEG version, but generally takes **longer to download** than the JPEG version. After the file is displayed, we suggest that you **set your viewing window as large as possible** and then **adjust the PDF magnification** so that the text can be read comfortably.

Telephone Numbers & Email Addresses: These documents were published many years ago. Please do **NOT** use them as a source for telephone numbers or email addresses for local businesses or agencies. THE ANTI-DIVA AT PRIDE DAY JUNE 15TH


Tri-Pride is pleased to announce that Carole Pope; queen of 80's alternative rock in Canada will be performing as the headline act at Pride Day, June 15th.

The trio joined forces in early 2002 and debuted on April 7th to a sold out crowd, at Tom Foolery's Comedy Club. Pride Week 2002, marked the group's second show at Tom Foolery's and was another smash hit. Building on their successes, Oot & Aboot moved to their new home at Mark Breslin's Yuk Yuk's where they have been performing quarterly shows throughout 2003.

GENTLEMAN REG

Currently based in Toronto, Gentleman Reg spent his teenage years in Guelph and is part of the same fertile scene that has produced the Constantines, Royal City and Jim Guthrie. He received critical acclaim last summer with the release of his second disc "Make Me Pretty". Gentleman Reg's lyrical and light approach to pop craft shares comparisons with Rufus Wainwright, Aimee Mann and Belle and Sebastien. He was a featured performer at Toronto and London Pride last year and we are pleased to have him performing on the tri-Pride stage this year.





THE STRAP-ONS

The Strap-Ons an all-girl band from London, Ontario, initially started as an acoustic group, but with the inclusion of a bass guitarist and drummer, their music evolved into what it is to-day: a unique blend of alt-pop-rock with country overtones. The name of the band often raises eyebrows, but it originally came about accidentally when lead vocalist Wanda Schneller arrived for practice with a guitar but no guitar strap. The joke became "better get your strap-on". The band liked the provocative nature of the phrase – and the reactions it generated – and recognized early on the potential benefits of having such a colorful name.

OLNA

Ottawa based band Anjo was originally formed in late 1999 by Anne Gauthier and Johanne Fulford. By spring 2000 the pair found themselves recording their first all-original CD titled "Margarita". Djembe drummer, Julie Richer, who would become part of the group, joined them on the album. After the successful launch of the CD and performances at various Women's Festival's the group continued to evolve. Adding a bass player and talented full percussionist Zandra Charbonneau. Their sound today is lively mix of blues and world beat influences. They are currently working on their second CD and their performance at this year's Pride will be their first time performing in our area.

A life student of gender disruptions, he has been performing as a drag king and bioqueen for over 9 years. As a co-founder of Fast Friday Productions, Luster is big papa to the International Drag King Extravaganza (IDKE), the cornerstone of the today's drag king culture and community. Wherever and whenever, Luster will be sharing his love with the world.




