Digitized Files - JPEG Version: The JPEG version is of **lower quality** than the PDF version, but will generally be **faster to download** than the PDF version. The files are set so that each page image takes up the full height of your viewing window; increasing the height of your viewing window will increase the size of the text. If your Internet download speed is lower, then this is a better option than the PDF version.

Digitized Files - PDF Version: The PDF version is of **higher quality** than the JPEG version, but generally takes **longer to download** than the JPEG version. After the file is displayed, we suggest that you **set your viewing window as large as possible** and then **adjust the PDF magnification** so that the text can be read comfortably.

Telephone Numbers & Email Addresses: These documents were published many years ago. Please do **NOT** use them as a source for telephone numbers or email addresses for local businesses or agencies. 
JUNE 5: SUNDAY - Pride day in Victoria Park

When Ashley MacIsaac burst on the worldwide scene with 1995's Hi, How Are You Today? (A&M) he scored the kind of coup instrumental artists often dream of. Going triple-platinum in Canada and breaking down radio barriers with the Gaelic single "Sleepy Maggie," Ashley became an immediate pop icon, rebellious and exuberant, resplendent in kilts, army boots and combat pants.

Growing up on Cape Breton Island, Nova Scotia, Ashley never listened to pop music (with the exception of AC/DC and Ozzy Osbourne). Instead, he listened to the recordings of the local master fiddlers like Angus Chisholm, Winston "Scotty" Fitzgerald, and Buddy MacMaster who would become Ashley's dominant influence.

Performing as a duo (traditional shows) or four piece (traditional/rock/fusion), Ashley MacIsaac plays the hottest traditional jigs and reels you'll ever hear with excitement, conviction, and a musical passion. Recalls Ashley, "My father once told me, 'If you want to play the fiddle, get mad at it or don't play it at all!"







Swamperella is a Toronto based Cajun band in it's ninth year of popularity. Spicy, melancholy, toe tapping, sexy, the Swamperella experience ''defies listeners to stay seated".

Swamperella's expression of music is deeply rooted in Cajun tradition and the

band's original material attests to a profound understanding of and connection to the 'Louisiana sound'

The music is infectious and the Swamperella approach is to pull out all the stops. The old fashioned waltzes drive forward in pulsating rhythm, the plaintive vocal harmonies wrap the listener in a haunting reminiscence, the washboard grooves get everyone moving and those that still won't dance find themselves clapping along and hollering.

Swamperella is a five piece band made up of: lead fiddler, vocalist and washboard player Soozi Schlanger. On button accordion, fiddle and vocals Peter Jellard, guitarist, Conny Nowe, bassist, Rachel Melas and percussionist, Dave Pontello.

Never one to rest, Charlena works, teaches violin and guitar, and is co-producing her debut album.



The Strap-Ons


London , Ontario 's allgirl/harmony junkie/power popsters, The Strap-Ons, have undergone a metamorphosis with the 2004 addition of guitarist Kris Abbott, formerly of The Pursuit of Happiness. As a result, the spectrum of the 5-some's musical offerings, once

anchored heavily in the power pop/alt country genre, has expanded to include straight-ahead, driving rock. Abbott's infectious guitar hooks, an integral part of TPOH's platinum and gold success in the late 80's through mid-90's, are a custom fit with the addictive melodies and esoteric simplicity generated by Wanda Schneller (vocals), Pam "Peeks" Armstrong (guitar), Dee McNeil (bass) and Monica "Mox" Miatello (drums). Although the band pays homage to the mainstream with an occasional cover, the group's primary products are original tunes - refreshingly parochial and universal - and typically candid tales of heartbreak from the band's collective experiences. The payoff of this unorthodox combination of industry veteran with indie, grass-roots, DIY'ers is as much visual as it is auditory. But all eye/ear-candy aside, the real appeal of seeing The Strap-Ons live is in experiencing the genuine passion and energy that result when five women who really love each other play music together.
