

Film crashes into viewers' memories

Bear with me for a moment, as I first need to comment that one of the few really well written pieces, the greatest things about the film Crash was its capacity to nearly convince the watcher that it's actually a great film. I thought it was good, but certainly not great. It's a compilation of a number of intertwining stories, and although one or two of them are worthy of the term "great", they don't really make up for the rest.

With one of the most star-studded and diverse casts I have seen in a while, Crash's stories explore the racial aspect of American society post-9/11, encompassing most races and the stereotypes that follow them. Crash explores the reasons racial crimes occur without criminalization. These crimes occur, and the perpetrators are not condemned. In some cases, this is done masterfully, but in others, it comes across more like a cheesy lesson.

One difficulty is the film's running time. It's short. With the length of time afforded, it's almost impossible to develop so many characters. Each character is integral to the story and supposed to be woven into the plot to create a complex, interlocking tapestry. Crash isn't quite long enough to do that. It allows for the development of some characters, but leaves many feeling nameless and defined only by their actions.

That's not to say Crash is a poorly made film, however. Outside of some scripting issues, it does a good job of convincing viewers of its greatness with elements of stellar quality. The acting in particular

is a high point. The all-star cast's performances are as good as the script allows them to be and, in the performances are excellent.

Crash is the sort of film that wins awards because of its ability to stay in the viewer's memory. History has shown us if a film is quotable then it does better. Crash is absolutely quotable, and its capacity of irritating the viewer makes it more memorable. Sometimes it seems like the writer's purpose for the film was merely to lecture on racism, but then the story pulls you in deeper and truly takes hold of us. And for those stories, Crash is worth it.

Musical Secrets 101: Mandy Barnett

Please allow me to let you in on a musical secret.

Her name is Mandy Barnett. She is a talented 30-year-old power singer living in Nashville, TN. Barnett tops many singers' favourites list including Trisha Yearwood and The Mavericks.

Born in Crossville, TN, Barnett got her first real recognition at the ripe age of 10 when she entered a singing contest at Dollywood theme park in Pigeon Forge, TN. Competing against 2,500 adults and children, she was awarded Best Country Act, and won the opportunity to make a demo tape in Nashville.

This was only the beginning. By the age of 13, Barnett had signed a record deal with Universal Records. Nothing ever came out of these early recordings with Universal due to some changes within the label.

In 1994, she won the muchacclaimed role of Patsy Cline in the musical production of Always ... Patsy Cline. The original cast recording featuring Barnett is available on CD and was released by MCA Records in 1995.

Barnett's self-titled debut album was released February 1996 on Asylum Records.

Songs swayed from classic country tunes to a sampling of her torchlike singing ability. It's not bad for a first album with catchy tunes of the then-new 90's country flair. This powerhouse vocalist was teasing listeners with this album, which left people wanting and even needing more.

The year 1998 brought a dream musical relationship into Barnett's sights: Music Row founder, Owen Bradley, who is infamous for his work with greats like Brenda Lee, Patsy Cline, and Loretta Lynn. Barnett jumped onboard with Sire records, and was allowed a bit more freedom in her musical endeavours.

Bradley and Barnett started working on her second album, I've Got A Right to Cry, a critically acclaimed project that was released

Bradley's visions plus Barnett's strong and haunting pipes made for an amazing album of emotion. This record would turn into Bradley's last project due to his untimely death half-way through the process.

I've Got a Right to Cry is one of those CDs that will bring dramatic ambiance into any evening. It will wrap around you like a fleece blanket and hold you tight with the lush strings and warm melodies.

Barnett is currently working on her next album, producing it herself.






